Some cats naturally have odd-coloured eyes, known as heterochromia




#### **2.** An extra eyelid!



# **5.** Super wide sight

Cats have 200° vision - 20° wider than a human's. This helps them spot what's approaching from the side, and they're also more sensitive to fast movements



#### 3. Perfect for hunting

Cats' vision is clearest when viewing objects around 6 metres away - close enough to nab that mouse



#### 4. Nifty at night

Sept.

A cat's night vision is 8 times better than ours, thanks to huge numbers of 'rod' cells, which allow eyes to detect things in low light
